Keys to Employability

- (<u>Accountability</u>)- taking responsibility for self
- (<u>Communication</u>) with adults & employers, thinking ahead, working through problems
- (<u>Introduction of trades)</u> Reliability & work ethic- showing up, consistency, focus (off phones)
- (Overcoming obstacles to employment)- Getting license and transportation secure, Construction Math and English skills, etc.
- * Students MUST begin working toward obtaining a license and transportation at this point and throughout the time of instruction.

Students will be taught by the "Dare to Succeed" Team of instructors and mentors. Real-life situations will be discussed and group participation and engagement is a must for each individual. Punctuality, respect, and an attitude to learn are required. Missing 2 or more classes will result in forfeiture of the right to remain enrolled in the program.

CPR & OSHA 10 certifications.

- 5 hours of CPR- 2 classes/10 hours of OSHA- 3 classes
- Students will come away with an understanding of the "Safety first" aspect of construction as it applies to many of the allied construction trades.

Students who have successfully met the requirements of the Construction Boot Camp will be eligible for the Pre-Apprenticeship Program

October 8 – December 20

- Students will need to report to work 3 days a week at 588-590
 Berkeley Road. Columbus, Ohio 43205
- This is an eight bedroom double owned by J.Jireh Development Corporation that needs complete gutting and renovation. This house will eventually be used as an abuse/ addiction recovery house for women.
- Students will have the opportunity to apply the knowledge they have learned to function in a real-world construction work environment: i.e. being a part of a supervised work crew, getting their hands (in work gloves) dirty, receiving instructions and having to carry them out in a timely manner, carrying heavy stuff, using a port-a-john, packing their lunch, arriving on time and ready to work, etc. They will see firsthand some of the rewards of construction in helping to transform a home and seeing the vision of what they can accomplish with their own hands with proper instruction.
- Students will be paid for their labor \$8.50/ hr. 3 days / week (~20 hrs/ week)
- Students will be evaluated after 2-3 week of the pre-apprenticeship to determine their aptitude for the construction trades. With good

performance, they will begin to receive specific Carpentry, plumbing, and electrical training in mid November and December. They will be tested both written and in a lab setting to determine their knowledge and apprehension of the concepts.

Students demonstrating apprehension of what is taught, reliability, work ethic, great attitude, and a drug free lifestyle, and having secure transportation will receive a certificate of completion and will be recommended to our network of employers for Early 2020.
